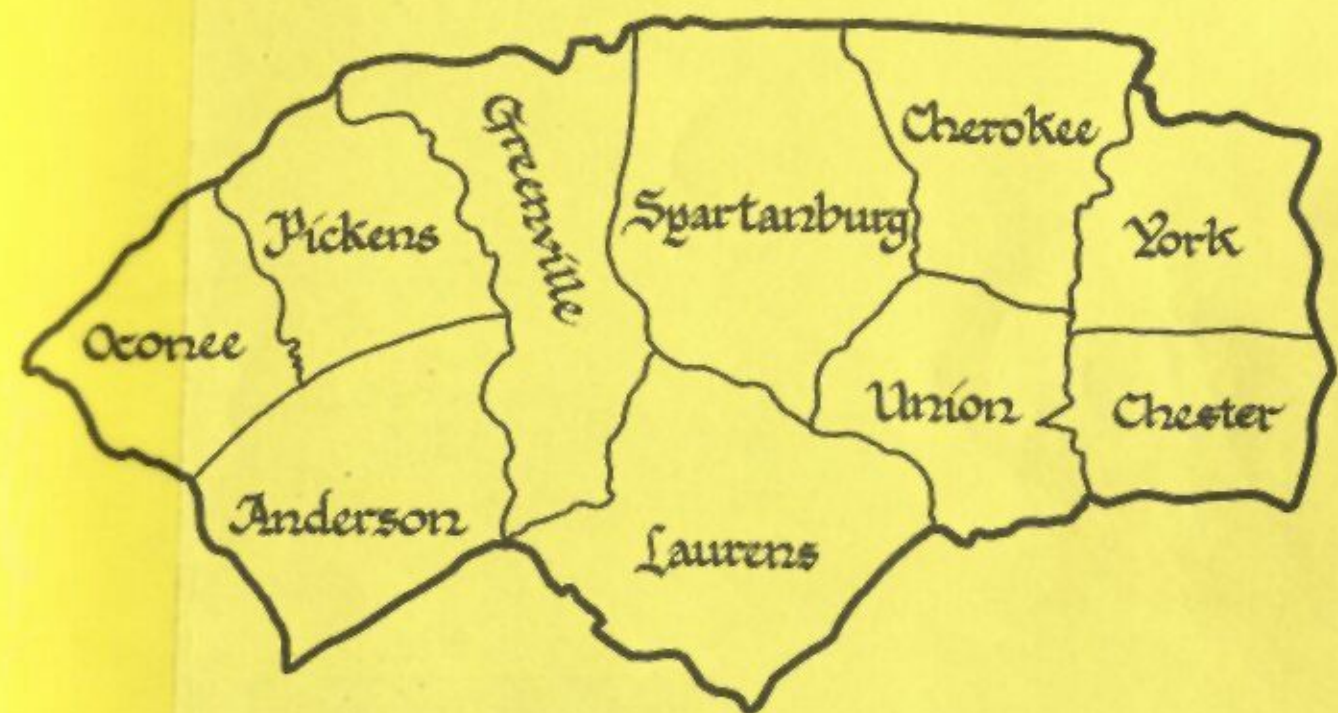

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McMAKEN'S TAVERN

The Stewart family has this manuscript. The house is known by many as the "Bud Stewart Home." From the way the article reads, we can assume the house was visited by a group of local historians.

This lovely old house, in front of which we are now standing was originally known as "McMaken's Tavern" and is so shown on Robert Mills' Map of 1825.

The original portion of the house was known to have been standing in 1810, and was constructed and owned by the McMaken family until 1840, when it was bought by Samuel Morgan, and has been continuously lived in by his descendants since that time, and is now owned by Mrs. Pearl Lanford, Miss Annie L. Stewart and Mrs. Marie S. Moore.

The road which runs in front of the house is now known as the Lyman-Holly Springs Road, but in the old days it was known as the "Goodjion Road", which branched off the old Saluda Gap Road and ran toward the mountains, at the end of which lived the family of Robert Goodjion.

The house was the seat of a rather complete community, having its own forge, grist mill, tan-yard (which made shoes for the slaves and the "white folks" in the "big house")....There was also a doctor's shop, and in the old records, now preserved by the owners of the house, it is stated that the doctor's fees for the treatment of typhoid fever among the slaves was more than \$1,000.00 for one year.

The plain, unpainted building, across the road in front of the house, is what remains of an old general store that operated long before and up until after the War Between the States - this store was most complete in its stock, carrying everything from the latest fashions for the ladies to seed and hardware for the plantation and community. Owners of the plantation would travel to Charleston by horseback and get a packet boat for New York for goods, and when buyer and goods were returned to Charleston, wagons would be purchased and loaded for the long overland trip back to the plantation store.

The plantation originally included several thousands of acres of land, and a short distance in a northwesterly direction from where we are now standing is the site of Wood's Fort, which was a refuge before and during the Revolutionary War, and where Spartanburg County Court was held several times following the organization of Spartanburg County in 1785. The McMaken land, which was obtained by grant from the King of England, extended almost to Wood's Fort, and at the crossing of the river near the Fort, is an old bridge and crossing, which has been known since the early days as "Granny McMaken's Bridge."

Over the years several changes have been noted in the plantation - the disappearance of the slave cabins, and most of the barns and farm buildings - as well as the disappearance of the old kitchen which stood several yards, as a separate building, to the

back of the "big house".

The structure of the house is of 16" timbers which are today pronounced "sound as a dollar"...and held together with wooden pegs. The old records show that the house was well planned and constructed, requiring three years in the building.

Please note the handsome Adam paneling across the front porch and the detailed workmanship around the front door and under the eaves of the roof. Records indicate that the wood used for this work was "put in the pond for wetting" and then "dried" for three different times before it was finally used, thus assuring the early craftsmen of sound hard wood.

Mrs. Lanford has graciously and kindly consented to allow us to see the interiors of the two front downstairs rooms. Authorities agree that the carving here is possibly the finest of the period in our county, and perhaps in the up-country of South Carolina.

THORNE MEMORIAL

The following marker is located at the Arrowwood Baptist Church which is about two miles west of Chesnee on Hwy 11 in Spartanburg County. The information is based on the research of the late Miss Jennie Smith, a direct descendant of this family.

SMITH-STONE CONNECTIONS

[Editor's Note: The following information was submitted by Mrs. Lucy D. Strickland, PO Drawer 1269, Hillsborough, NC 27278. It is being presented here in the form it was received with the hope that it will be of help to our readers.]

Family tradition has informed me that one of my great-great grandmothers was CATHARINE SMITH (1798-1875) who married MOSES STONE and who lived a substantial part of her life at Cedar Springs, Spartanburgh District, South Carolina. Catharine was the daughter of JANE ROSS (daughter of JAMES ROSS of Orange County, North Carolina, who died ca. 1793) and Captain JAMES SMITH. James Smith was from Prince William County, Virginia, and was in Spartanburgh District probably before the Revolutionary War. As early as 1803 he was a surveyor and Commissioner of Location in Spartanburgh District.

One daughter of Catharine and Moses Stone was REGINA MINERVA STONE, who married Dr. JAMES WRIGHT TRACY and moved to Cleveland County, North Carolina, where she lived out her life, dying in 1894 survived by one child, CATHARINE LEONORA TRACY, who married PLATO DURHAM in 1868 and, being widowed in 1875, married BEN FRANKLIN DIXON in 1877.

Recently I have come into possession of an assortment of family letters and other papers, mostly contemporaneous with the lifetime of Catharine. These papers indicate other facts as follows:

I.

Two relatives of Captain JAMES SMITH in Virginia were a sister, LETTICE REARDON, and a Mr. HANCOCK (family tradition says James' mother was LETITIA HANCOCK).

Captain JAMES SMITH (1748-1807) died in Spartanburgh District, leaving land at Cedar Springs. He was survived by his wife, JANE, who was still living in 1826, and by several children. Their children were twelve:

WILLIAM HENRY SMITH, 1771-1773

WILLIAM ROSS SMITH, 1773-1818

JAMES SMITH, JR. 1782-1856

HANCOCK SMITH, 1787-1827

GEORGE L. SMITH, who died in Georgia on March 3, 1867, survived at least by his wife and a son, Dr. JUBILEE SMITH, of Americus, Georgia. He was also survived by a son, GEORGE B. SMITH, a grandson JOHN T. SMITH, and a daughter who married in 1858 and moved to Arkansas. George L. Smith in a letter to his sister, Catharine Smith Stone, dated February 23, 1859, refers to JOHN LYNCH "from Old Orange County who is Uncle John Lynch's grandson."

MATILDA SMITH, married to AMBROSE STONE by 1842, living in Marion County, Alabama, in 1844 (see below, part II)

SUSANNAH SMITH, married BARNETT, living in Campbell County, Georgia, in 1842; had sons W.H. BARNETT, SMITH BARNETT, married 1842 to ELIZA, living in Cass County, Georgia, in 1848, CYPRIAN F. BARNETT living in Talladega, Alabama in 1848, and daughter GABRIELLA married JACKSON (unclear whether this is given

name or surname), had child about 1841. Other Barnetts mentioned are MICAHAH BARNETT and LAVAN BARNETT, but relationships are not clear.

LETITIA HANCOCK (LETTICE) SMITH, married to DAVID LYNCH, living in Clarke County, Georgia, in 1827

Three daughters (names unknown), one of whom died in childhood
CATHARINE SMITH, 1798-1875, youngest child of her parents, married MOSES STONE, brother to AMBROSE STONE (see below, parts II and III).

II.

MOSES STONE was living in Spartanburgh District as early as 1823 and was dead by February, 1845 (probably died in October, 1844) in Spartanburgh District. MOSES STONE'S papers mention many persons named Stone, but the names of his parents are not identified. It seems clear that the following were brothers and sisters of Moses:

HILLORY STONE, living in Franklin County, Georgia, 1823; married to MATILDA _____ (?); son CLIFFORD STONE born 1822

AMBROSE STONE, living in Marion County, Alabama, in 1844; married to MATILDA SMITH (daughter of Captain James Smith); had sons BUSHROD W. STONE, WILLIAM STONE, and JOHN STONE, and daughters LOUISA and ANGELINA; William and John Stone died in 1842 at ages of 20 and 17 respectively, and Angelina died ca. 1852.

TILMAN (TILMON) STONE, was constable in Spartanburgh District in 1841; was grantee of 256 acres on Gap Creek Waters of Saluda River in 1833; had son TILMAN who moved to Alabama by 1844

PHARIS STONE

HENRY STONE, deceased in Spartanburgh District by October 21, 1842

SAMUEL STONE, deceased ca. December, 1826; Moses Stone was his executor in Spartanburgh District, 1827.

ARON STONE

JOHN W. STONE, living at Croll(?) Mountain, Alabama, in 1844; his daughter NANCY STONE married TARPLEY (not clear whether Tarpley is given or surname)

ZEALY STONE, living in Union County, Georgia, 1846

CEBERN (SEABORN) STONE

WILLIAM STONE

LOVINA STONE, married _____ GOLIGHTLY

The mother of these Stones was said to be dying in 1823.

Moses Stone and several of his brothers were apparently hatmakers, and Moses also kept receipts for sales of cotton.

In 1831 Robert James contracted to build a house for Moses Stone in Spartanburgh District.

MARY STONE (relation not clear) signed a promissory note in 1841 and was grantee in conveyance of 41 acres on Lindsey Branch of Pacolet River in November, 1841, adjoining William Tracy.

D.I. STONE (relation not clear) and MIRANDA CAMPBELL were licensed to marry in Dollar (?) County, Alabama, March 25, 1825.

III.

CATHARINE and MOSES STONE had five children, all daughters:

REGINA MINERVA STONE, born January 6, 1824; married to JAMES WRIGHT TRACY in 1844; children RUSH TRACY (1847-1870) and CATHARINE LEONORA TRACY (1845-1933); died 1894, buried in Cleveland County, North Carolina.

JANE MELISSA STONE, born September 10, 1827; apparently died young.

SUSAN ANN STONE, born September 20, 1829; married to THOMAS B. BORDLY; daughter born May 24, 1850; daughter ALICE BORDLY born 1852.

CATHARINE LETTICE STONE, born June 24, 1832; married to WILLIAM BRIGGS; died 1859, buried in Cleveland County, North Carolina.

MARTHA LOVINA STONE, born July 15, 1834; attended H.C.F. College in Asheville in 1857; married to Dr. J.L. NEAGLE by 1861; living in Gaston County, North Carolina, in 1864.

In 1847 Catharine Stone paid tuition to E.F. Bobo for Susan Ann, Catharine, and Martha, and in 1850, to W. Allen for Martha.

BLALOCK FAMILY BURIAL GROUND

The following inscriptions were copied December 14, 1978 by W.C. Wilburn, T.J. Caldwell and J.E. Hart, Jr. from tombstones found in a family burial ground located about two miles up Kings Creek from SC Highway #5, just off the power line from Ninety-nine Islands to Kings Mountain, NC:

Notes: Daniel Asbury Fullton was born Aug. 5, 1804, son of James Began Fullton and his wife Anna Statia (Tuel) Fullton, and was therefore 39 years and 56 days old at his death. His wife was Elizabeth Blalock, daughter of Jeremiah and Lucy Blalock above; they were married Jan. 4, 1827, when Elizabeth was about 15 years of age.

Mary W. Whisonant was born about 1785, daughter of Jeremiah and Lucy Blalock. She was the first wife of Michael Whisonant who was born Sep. 17, 1786, died Nov. 3, 1854, and was buried in Antioch Baptist Churchyard.

KUYKENDAL FAMILY BURIAL GROUND

The following inscriptions were copied about 1939 by J.E. Hart, Jr., from tombstones found in a family burial ground found on a one-time Lowry family plantation, off State Road 347, south of its intersection with State Road 1172, on Fishing Creek in York County, SC. As of January 13, 1981, both stones have been destroyed.

TWO DEATHS SADDEN PEOPLE OF SENECA

Seneca, March 24, - Mrs. Martha Hall died at her residence near here at 5 o'clock yesterday morning after a lingering illness of several months. She was the widow of the late T.J. Hall, who preceded her to the grave some 25 years ago. Before her marriage she was Miss Jenkins, daughter of James Jenkins, one of the stalwart pioneer citizens of this section. She is survived by the following children: W.P. Hall, Walhalla; Thomas N., and James E. Hall, Westminster, and C.C. Cary, Paris, Texas; Mrs. Joe McConauey, Lenoir, N.C.; Miss Wynona Cary, Honea Path, and Harry W. Cary, of Charleston. Mr. Cary was a man who commanded the respect of all who knew him. The large company of representative people that followed the body to the grave was a testimony to the regard in which he was held in Seneca, his old home.

JOE CREWS SHOT

The Greenville News of yesterday morning brought a detailed account of the shooting of Joe Crews and Charlie Bollin, on the road from Laurens to Newberry, about 4 miles below Laurens. The shooting was with a double barrel shot-gun. Five bullets struck Crews - one about the collar and two on each side of the back bone. Dr. Dunklin, who attended the wounded parties, does not consider Crews' wounds dangerous.

While we candidly confess that we have no sympathy for Crews, and have been apprehensive that such a fate would overtake him, we were in hopes his punishment would come from a decree of law. We have never known violence to correct an evil, but it generally aggravates it.
