BOOK REVIEWS

A History and Genealogy of the Penuel Price Family with Allied Families of Beaty, Sadler, Bryson by Marian Price Hart. Order from the author at 1545 Parrish Place, Jacksonville, Florida 32205. Hard bound, 246 pages, including full name index, illustrated. \$21.50, including postage and handling.

As Mrs. Hart stated in her introduction, at times, it is not an easy task to trace one's roots. Such is the case with greatgreat-grandfather, Penual Price, born 1785 and died August 6, 1864, in Anderson County, SC. There are many Prices and the author feels that she doesn't have enough evidence to try and prove Penuel's parentage. So, she beigns with him and traces the family from there. The resulting volume contains many families from the Piedmont area, with special emphasis on the allied lines of Beaty, John Bryson (born ca. 1745) of Laurens County, SC, and the Richard Sadler family of York County, SC.

The book itself is printed on quality paper and well bound. The text is large enough for a person with the most faltering vision to read it with ease. Mrs. Hart's numbering system for each generation is logical and easy to follow. Perhaps my favorite feature of The Penuel Price Family is the documentation. Mrs. Hart not only provides a transcript of documents important to the documentation of this pedigree, she provides actual reproductions of the papers when possible -- a novel and practical idea.

This book is a welcome addition to those doing Price research. It is also a model for those wanting to produce a good genealogy. I heartily recommend it.

WILLIAM BYARS/BYERS OF THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR PERIOD

In search of the parents of my Great Grandfather, Thomas T. Byars Born ca. 1836. He as well as his parents were born in South Carolina, according to the 1880 Chester County SC Census. He raised his family in Chester County, and is buried there. This search has led to many interesting discoveries, not only to the variety of spellings of the two main lines, Byars/Byers, but to the frustrating fact of two persons of the same name being in the same Archives File: Spartanburg Dist., File #436, Box 3, Pkg. 15 (See I and II below), and two persons of the same name filed together in the Pension Application File (see I and IV below). It was at this point I decided some one needed to try to sort out the various Williams-Seven (?) of them! The Byers of York County, SC (III and IV), and the Byers of Rutherford County, NC and Spartanburg District, SC (I, II, and V) were two distinct families, and to date I have not found them intermarrying. The Williams (VI and VII) are not yet clear to us in their relationship to the other Byars of South Carolina. The National DAR Numbers listed by each William, are all the

Williams in their records.

I believe there are many more descendants who may have information that would help in our search. We expecially need to know more about those sons where no information is listed by their name. Who they married, who their children were, etc. I do want to know who the parents of my Thomas T. Byars were! So, if anyonme has knowledge of these, or any other Byars/Byers, or any allied line, PLEASE SHARE IT. Corrections and/or additions are most welcome. Postage gladly refunded. Their children were: Polly, Betsy, Amy, Franky, and John who married Catherine , who were born between ca. 1790 and 1794 in Spartanburg, Dist., SC. The family then moved to Chester Dist., SC ca. 1794-1795 where Reuben, Sally and Susan were born between 1795 and 1799. About 1802-1803 the family returned to Spartanburg Dist., SC where the youngest child Isaiah was Born ca. 1803. (Isaiah went to Pickens Co., Ala). James Byars became a tenant in 1804 for Michael Gaffney.

The 1790 census, Spartanburg Dist. shows only 10 houses between James BYRAR and William BIAS.

Was this the James Byars who purchased 200 acres, west side of Broad River, including two imporvements on River, 1 Jan. 1787? (Vol. 11, p. 47, State Plats, SC 28 Jan. 1786). In the Index to SC Land Grants there are four listings in the year 1787 for James Byars (Vol. 15, p. 168, and Vol. 16, pp. 109, 440). Is this the same James Byars?

On 19 Nov. 1805 James Byars sold 42 acres on west side of Broad River to William Ellis (Bk. K, p. 426). Thomas Byars and William Wilson were witnesses. Who was this Thomas, and what relation to James? (A Thomas Byars appears on Spartanburg Dist. census records for the years 1800, 1810, 1820). Where did this Thomas go?

Was Nathan Byars, Sr. another Rev. War soldier, Born 1749 Granville Co., NC Died 1846 Spartanburg Co., SC related to William And James? Nathan had land where the National Cowpens Battleground is in Cherokee, Co., SC.

YOUTH CRUSHED TO DEATH

CRUSHED TO DEATH .- James Pickett, a youth of about Twelve, son of the Rev. G. W. Pickett, was caught while ginning cotton on last Saturday, between the machinery, and crushed to death .-Chester Reporter.

The following will was found in the Office of the Probate Judge in Union County, in a box labled "Detached Orders and Decrees". This will was NEVER probated in Union or Newberry County.

State of South Carolina Union District

I Anna P. Hardy of the State and District aforesaid being of sound and disposing mind memmory and understanding do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament disposing of all my estates both real and personnal in manner and form following i.e.

Clause first I give and bequeath one hundred dollars to be applied to fencing or otherwise improving the burying ground at Ebenezer Church near Maybinton in Newberry District.

Clause second I give and bequeath to the Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church South three hundred dollars to be applied for the support of the Gospel at the said Ebenezer Church near Maybinton in Newberry District

Clause Third I give and bequeath to my daughter Catherine Hardy the use of my Tract of land in Newberry on which she with her husband and family now reside, during her natural life. Clause Fourth I give and bequeath to my Daughter Francis Douglas the use of my Anderson Tract of Land, on which I reside,

during new natural life

Clause fifth It is my desire that all my Household and kitchen furniture and all my other property of whatsoever kind not disposed of by this my last will and testament and all my negroes that may be left after paying my just debts and funeral expenses be divided into two lots or shares and I give and begueath one lot or share thereof to Each of my Daughters Catherine Hardy and Francis Douglass to them and their heirs forever

Clause Sixth. I give divise and bequeath to my grand children Thomas P. Hardy, Gustavus A. Hardy, Charles W. Hardy, Francis E. Hardy, James H Hardy William D. Hardy and George E Hardy, Childn of my Daughter Catherine Hardy, my Tract of Land in Newberry District subject to the use specified and set forth in clause third of this my will. also my negroes (slaves) Munford, Silas, Henry Anderson Mary and child and Caroline and children, now in the Employ of my Son in Law William E Hardy and Harner and Jim whom I have in my own Employ to them share and Share alike to Each during the term of his or her natural life and then to his or her child or children forever

Clause seventh I give divise and bequeath to my Grand children Laura A. Douglass, James T. Douglass, Garaphelia A. Douglass, Sarah B Douglass Almira E. Douglass Anna P. Douglass Jane T. Douglass, George Douglass and William Joseph Douglass, Children of my Daughter Francis Douglass my Anderson Tract of land on which I live subject to the use specified and set forth in clause fourth of this my will also my negroes, slaves, Jacob, Mimy, Winny, Balaam, Pelina, Thomas Milly, John, Chatty & child and Charles

which slaves are in the employ of my son-in Law George Douglass, and Amanda, Caroline and Eliza & her children whom I have in my own Employ to them Share and Share alike to each during the time of his or her natural life and then to his or her child or children forever

Clause Eight Furthermore it is my desire that if any of my grand children shall die leaving no child or children him or her surviving them that the share given divised and bequeathed by this my last will & Testament to such deceased be equally divided amongst the brothers & sisters of said deceased, the child or children of a deceased brother or sister taking the share of the deceased parent.

Clause ninth It is my desire that my old negroes Stephen, Jinny and Molly have the privilige of choosing with which of my children they will live

Clause Tenth I desire that all my crops Horses Mules and other live stock, My wagons Carriage & plantation tools, or so much thereof as may be necessary to pay all my just debts and funeral Expensives and to pay the bequests made in the first and second Clauses of this my will be sold and that the Said debts Expenses and bequeats be paid and if more be sold than may be necesary to discharge the Said debts Expenses and bequeaths it is my desire that the ballance be divided as directed in Clause fifth of this my will

Clause Eleventh Finally I constitute and appoint my Sonsin-Law William E Hardy and Dr George Douglass Executors of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and Seal this sixteenth day of May A.D. One Thousand Eight hundred & fifty nine

Unlike other cemetery books, this one is crafted to meet the genealogist's needs by paying special attention. to the plot and row arrangement of the graves. It presents transcripts of 58 Spartanburg County cemeteries in their entirety. Among the churches presented are Philadelphia Baptist, Bethesda Baptist, Concord Methodist, Mount Carmel Methodist, New Hope Methodist, and North Pacolet Presbyterian. In all, 21 churches, including 7 extinct ones, are published. Also, 34 family cemeteries, and 3 community and private cemeteries appear here.

Marriages From THE CAROLINA SPARTAN Newspapers 1866-1869, compiled and edited by Faye Berry Emory 27 pages, indexed. Soft cover \$6.50

This is a complete listing of 1866-1869 marriages found in THE CAROLINA SPARTAN, a Spartanburg, South Carolina newspaper. Although these marriages are found in Spartanburg newspapers, they are not confined to that area. Many pertain to persons living in other counties of South Carolina and a few concern persons living in other states.

The Descendents of James Crook and Related Families 1746-1978. Compiled and edited by Martha King Neubauer 463 pages, including 63 page index. \$42.00

The society has acquired the 28 remaining copies of this detailed study of the James Crook family of Virginia and later Spartanburg County, S.C. However, the late Mrs. Neubauer did not limit this work to this particular family. She included information on other branches of the Crook family in England and America. She also included pictures of tombstones and various Crook homes. The second part includes information on the following related families: Anthony, Bane, Barry, Brockman, Burk, Coleman, Evins, King, Mann, Newman, Patton, Stallworth, Travis, and White families. "Bits and Pieces" (Part III) is an abstract from records of persons of the same surname, but with whom no proof of relationship has been established.

Reminiscences of The War Between The States, by W. R. Tanner. 26 pages, soft cover.

W. R. Tanner was a Confederate veteran who lived at Cowpens, Spartanburg County, SC. J. R. Gainey has acquired from his family all the remaining copies of his reminiscences, which were published in 1931. They tell the story of how one participant viewed the Civil War and relates some anecdotes of his comrades. Also included is a roster of Company C, 13th South Carolina Regiment. A must for any Civil War buff.

Fage Berry has abstracted the information found in the 1820 federal census for the over 1,500 families then living in Chester District. (Included in this volume are 14 families headed by "free persons of colour.") This volume eliminates the need of sitting in front of a microfilm viewer to find your ancestor's family here in 1820. It is a great research aid presented in a easy to use size and format.

The History of Mount Zion Church and Her People, by Dr. J. B. O. Landrum, edited by Joseph R. Gainey. 17 pages plus index, soft cover. \$5.00

This is a republication of a 1885 volume on Mount Zion Baptist Church, near Imman, Spartanburg County, SC. It traces the church from its establishment as a mission of Bethlehem Baptist in 1804, through it organization in 1827, up to the history's publication in 1884. This volume, though small in size, contains a wealth of information, both historical and genealogical, on Mount Zion and its early members.

This is first in a two volume set which will include all of the Piedmont. Chester, Greenville, Spartanburg, Union, York, and Pickens Districts are in this volume. (Pickens at the time incorporated what is now Oconee County. Cherokee County was then found as part of Spartanburg, Union, and York counties.) Ms. Berry has listed all persons legible on the microfilm copy at the S. C. state archieves. She has given their name, sex, age, race, and month of death as reported by the enumerator.

An Account of Marriages Solemnized By Tolaver Robertson In South Carolina Between October 1842 & February 1867, edited by Joseph R. Gainey. 16 pages plus index. \$5.00

Rev. Tolaver Robertson kept an account of the marriages he "solemnized". This is not an unusual practice. What is unusual is that he published it in 1867. However, only one copy is known to have survived. This is a republication of the material found in it. Since marriage records were not kept by the State of South Carolina before 1911, this is a great boon to genealogists, especially those with roots in Laurens and Greenville counties. Robertson recorded 364 marriages for nearly 275 different sumames.
