John Thomas Thomas, Sr., b. 7 October, 1752, Richmond Co., Va. D. 2 Feb.,1834, at Sptbg. Co., prob. Woodruff area. Wed: Nancy (Possibly Broughton),b. (b. c 1760-65, per Ivey). D. 20 May, 1841, Sptbg. Co., S.C. Burial location unknown. TJohn moved to Sptbg. from Va. ca 1802. John was a Sgt. in the Rev. War. From Rev. Robert Ivey of Gaffney, S.C. "John Thomas, Sr. entered the service of the U.S. against Great Britain Feb. 1778 from Richmond Co., Va. He was first sent to Valley Forge & spent part of that awful winter with General George Washington & his troops. He fought at the Battle of Mammouth Court House with Washington. Next, he went to White Plaine, Conn. After this the troops moved to Middleberry, in the Jerseys. John was discharged at Middleberry Feb. or Mar. 1779, having served a full year in the service of his country." His pension is #S-22014. He was in the infantry with the regulars. He served the 5th Regt. under Gen. Mulenberg.

In an article published in the Sptbg.-Herald on Sun. Dec. 13, 1908, col. 3, pg. 11: "Mrs. Susan Thomas, who lives in the forks of the Tygers, has in her possession a powder horn that belonged, if I mistake not, to her grandfather or gt-gd-father that likely did service in that battle (Kings Mountain)." This horn now belongs to James Rex Skinner, s/o Alton & Lucretia Pearson Skinner. James is a gt-gt-gd-son of Samuel Thomas & gt-gt-gd-son of John Thomas, Sr. I looked up the article & found no author's name. There is one error in the article. Mrs. Susan or Susannah McCarley Thomas' father, Robert McCarley, came to this country after the Rev. War from Ireland. The powder horn, now is the possession of Miss Callie Thomas, Woodruff, S.C., belonged to Mrs. Susan Thomas' husband, Samuel Thomas, & was passed down through the Thomas family. The horn belonged to Samuel Thomas' gd-father.

John Thomas wed: Nancy \_\_\_\_\_\_,b. d. 20 May, 1841, Sptbg. Co., S.C. We have no clue as to her maiden name, unless she was a Broughton. It was a custom to name sons for their grand-fathers. This was the first known appearance of this name in the family.

The following census & Price Shore House Journals from 1816-1820 are from Rev. Robert Ivey.

Floyd went into the Confederate service he was put in the hospital to help take care of the sick. The yellow fever was raging at the time. John H. Floyd found his brother Enoch B. Floyd seriously ill with the yellow fever. John H. nursed his brother until he died one week later. John H. stayed on in the hospital. He, too, had yellow fever for two wks. & left riding his mule. He went by his mother's Jennie Thomas Floyd's & told her of her son's death. Then he went on to his home. His wife, Mary Adaline Mason Floyd met him & he asked her to take the mule & put it in the stable. John H. Floyd went into the house, went to bed & died in his speep the next morning." "

"John H. Floyd had a brother, Pinckney Floyd, who had a horror of the war & did not want to go when he was called for service. His mother, Jennie Floyd, dug a pit, then built a pig pen & set the pen over the pit after she had put Fink in the pit. When heshe went to feed her pigs she took her son his meals. Later the son was discovered by the law officers & was forced to serve his time in the war."

Cem., Walnut Grove, S.C. John H. is buried in old Unity Bapt. ch cem., but was never a member of a church. Mary A. was rec'd by exp. into Unity 22 Sept., 1868.
