UNITY BAPTIST CHURCH MINUTES

Spartanburg County, S. C.
Unity Baptist Church was Constituted August 14th 1818 by Elders Thomas Greer, Nathan Langston & Thomas Westhers.
We the Baptist Church of Christ at Unity holding the guilt of original sin by the fall, Justification by the imputed righteousness of Chirst, final perserverence of the saints in Grace, the resurrection from the dead, and final Judgment, believers [in] Baptism by immersion, adopt the following rules.
1st Members are reciev'd into Church fellowship by experience, Baptism by Immersion, and by letter –
2nd Each member [is] to attend Church meeting once a month & on the neglect twice to be call'd to account, especially the males –
3rd the Minister is the moderator in all Church meetings, in case of [his] absence the Church to church to choose another
4th when diversity of opinion takes place on any subject that of a majority should be reciev'd
5th the Deacons duty is to receive any contributions made by the members, or any other person, for the support of the Gospel, or the expence of the Communion table, and also to collect any [illegible word] that may be on any subscription they hold –

6th no Member shall move out of the bounds of the Church without first applying for a letter of

dismission, nor leave Church meeting without leave of the Church –

7th all members preent at Sacramental seasons shall take their seats, unless some matters of dealings unsettled prevent
8th members who have been suspended or excommunicated giving satisfactory evidence of their repentance, are to be reciev'd into full fellowship of the Church
9th let each member abstain from evil company, as much as their worldly business will admit of
10th any motion made and spoken to in time of Conference, the member that speaks Shall rise & address the Moderator, and but one speak at a time $\frac{1}{2}$
11th the moderator shall be entitled to the same liberty of speech as any other member, provided he appoint some other Member to his seat while he is speaking $-$
the record of our procedure while an arm of Friendship [Baptist] Church [1819-1820], and for the first year after our Constitution not being in possession brings me under the necessity of starting at the date below John Brewton, C.C.

June [1820] Simon servant [of] R. Alexander who was excluded from us while we were an arm of Friendship came with acknowledgement and was restor'd to fellowship
July [1820] receiv'd Jane Vise and Sarah Rogers by letter, receiv'd Phil servant of R. Willis by experience – receiv'd Jesse Vaughn by experience –
August [1820] prefer'd charges against a negro called Isaac Rogers, and Clary servant of Robt Rogers of living in adultery, John Thornton to cite her to next meeting, & M. Eskrige and Henry White to cite him – Brethren John Thornton, James Mason and John Brewton delegated to the Association –
September [1820] excluded Posey's Milley for stealing money from her Master, excluded Isaac & Clary for the above charges. Harriot Burton dismiss'd by letter
November [1820] Fereby Clark excluded for raising false slanderous reports against sisters of the

June 16 [1821] prefer'd a charge against William Gennings of neglecting Church meetings & professing to have aught against members of the Church and refusing to take measures for a reconciliation appointed Brethren James Corder & Absalom Wright to cite him to next meeting

August 18, [1821] John Thornton, James Mason & John Brewton delegates to the Association

September [1821] Samuel Eskrige excluded for various charges of falsehood and removing privately to injury of his creditors, Sarah Burks apply'd by letter for a letter of dismission, granted. Letters of dismission granted to Luke Thornton & wife Sarah—letters have been granted to John Brooks & Patton's Charety, the entry not found –

October: [1821] Casander Whittemore dismiss'd by letter, receiv'd a charge against Alexander's Simon for the sin of Adultery. James Reynolds and William Mason to cite him to next meeting, receiv'd a charge against George Floyd for the sin of fornication –

Novemr 17 [1821] the case of G. Floyd laid over at his request sent – Posey's Milley restor'd to fellowship. Alexander's Simon excluded for the sin of adultery

December 5, [1821] Azariah Vise & his wife Jane dismiss'd by letter –

[December] 14, [1821] took up a charge against David Hudgins for leaving his wife, excessive drinking, and rioting. Ford Mason & Nathaniel Gentry to cite him to next meeting, Milliy Whittmore dismiss'd by letter, receiv'd a charge against Thirza Hudgens for the sin of fornication. Lucretia Stripling & Judy Thomas to cite her to next meeting. George Floyd excluded for the above charge –

May 18, [1822] Frances Smithwick received by letter from Cedar Spring Church – Samuel Thomas excluded for a violation of our rules in going off without applying for a letter of dismission & also absconding in debt

June 15th [1822] Mary Arnold dismiss'd by letter – charg'd Sister Bobo's Adam last meeting for swearing, dancing & adultery, Joel G. Brewton & John Brewton cited him to this meeting, he is excluded – charg'd Middleton Shearbert with the sin of fornication –

July 20th [1822] Frances Gentry dismiss'd by letter – Middleton Sherbut excluded – Milley Whittemore returned her letter

August 17 [1822] elected James Mason & John Brewton delegates to the Association

Sep. 14th [1822] Lucretia Smith dismiss'd by letter

December 14th [1822] James Reynolds dismiss'd by letter – Nancy Hudgens excluded for raising a slanderous report against Elizabeth Stripling, and going off with a man in disorder

June 14 [1823] Jack servant of John White charg'd with playing the fiddle and tolerating fiddleing & dancing in his house, Brethren J. Thornton and T. Niton to cite him to meeting.

Rogers to cite Sealy White a woman of color to attend our next meeting to answer to reports of falsehood against her.

May 20, [1826] Nathaniel Gentry neglecting to attend meeting was excluded; Sarah McDaniel charg'd with the sin of fornication; Mary Robuck & Elizabeth Barnett to cite her to meeting –

June 17, [1826] Sarah McDaniel excluded, Elizabeth Stripling not giving up her letter to another Church which she recd from us and joining in dancing is excluded

[June 17,] 1826 – Richard Gentry charg'd with imprudently saying that Elizabeth Fowler had sworn falsely he acknowledg'd he has said more than he ought and was sorry for it –

July 15, [1826] made choice of Elder James Rainwater for a supply --

August 19, [1826] Frances Smithwick dismiss'd by letter – Absolam Wright excluded for running off a negro not his own, Elected John Thornton & John Brewton delegates to the Association.

Sepr 16 [1826] Sarah Ragan join'd by experience, Ann, William & Frances Corder with Peter Bragg and Sarah his wife dismiss's by letter. Receiv'd Elder James Rainwater a Pastoral supply

October 14, [1826] John Thornton, Elizabeth his wife & James Corder dismiss'd by letter – Elizabeth Fowler charg'd with going out of the counsel of the Church in going to law with Richd Gentry (a Brother), John Brewton & James Mason to cite her to next meeting --

Dec 16, [1826] Aily Marler recd by experience – Mary Kelley receiv'd By letter from Forkshoal Church. Rhoda Lawrence dismiss'd by letter –

1827 Feb. 17. appointed Brethren T. Scott, Jas. Mason & John Brewton to act discretionally in a difficulty between Milley Shurley & Richard Gentry and report to next meeting -- Mary Gentry excluded for saying she wish'd the Devil had George Floyd and indulging in hard spirit against Members of the Church [and] refusing labours for a reconciliation –

June 16, [1827] Sarah Stephens, Nancy Marler & Ligon's Patty rec'd by experience, the case of Sister Shurley & Richard Gentry continued

July 14, [1827] the Brethren appointed to act in the difficulty between Richard Gentry & Milly Shurley report it amicably settled

Feb 19, [1831] Sarah Barnett, Elizabeth Barnett, Allen Stone, and Moriah his wife dismiss's by letter; the case of Phil laid over at the request of his master and himself – Jesse Hindman excluded for taking ardent spirits to freely and fighting at the ordinaries election in August and justifying his act of fighting. Price Skinner and Wm Mason to cite Betty servant of J. Bragg to attend and answer to reports against her of dancing and using profane language – Aza' Vise & Elias Rogers to cite Jesse Ragan to attend and account for reports against him of intoxication – chose Jas Rianwater to continue our supply –

Crow to inform him the Church was waiting on his, Sep – after lengthy discussion again laid over. October all hopes of reconciliation between A. Vise and the Church having fled he was excluded – Jemima Waddell join'd by experience. Patsey former servant of J. Crow excluded for impudence to her mistress and disobedience to he master & threats against Nancy Moore -- Brethren T. Scott & P. Salmon to cite Jas A. Strange for neglecting church meetings –

Mary Alexander
To the Brothers & Sisters of Unity Church as I am verry old and feeble but sound in mind and recollection and cannot be with you personally and for the information of you and those who may follow you, I give you some outlines as to Unity Church and its origination.

In my early recollection Unity Church was then called Floyds Meeting House it was built for the benefit of the Baptist and ocupied by three Denominations, the Baptists, Presbyterians & Methodist. the Baptist preaching regular on their meeting days, the Presbyterians preaching regular on their days which was Wednesdays. Ther Preacher was James Gilleland. the Methodist preaching regular on ther days Preaching manny Funerals. ther Preacher was John Mullinax was a noble man & a noble Preacher loved & liked by all morel [moral?]people I cannot speak to high of John Mullinax. I believe if there was ever a Christian he was one. God bless him he is in Heaven. would we had more men like him.

I was Baptized by Miles Rainwaters bless him he is in Heaven. in my early days there was no confusion and rasping or guarbling through Denominations & no ill feelings through the neighborhood. all was Social kind & affectionate Seldom eaver any dissatisfaction all seamed as one

family all friends & obliging kind to each other. all seamed like one Church. all went to hear all the Preachers Preach far and near. & evry thing went smoothly along. thanks to the allmighty God for his blessing earth in them good old days.

I Joined the Church in my 18th year & have bin a faithful old soldier & never regret that I followed my Master. I often shead tears when I think of them good old days. I am now living on borowed time but am true to my heavenly master. Brothers & Sisters I would like to be with you but I am to old and feeble I cannot be with you but I have one request of you all pray for me & pray unseasingly there is victory worth gaining for us all & let us be prepared when we leave this world to meet in a world where there is no pain Sorrow & disturbence. May the Lord bless you all is the Prayer of your old Sister Mary Alexander


